Recently I applied for a grant in 2017-18 for my pastoral study project, "Toward Reconciliation: Building Solidarity on the Periphery." My study project begins with a theological reflection and moves toward my leadership question for our church today: Why does reconciliation matter in the church, and how can we build reconciled relationships among diverse people?

Working toward God's reconciliation is a theological and missional task. Reconciliation is manifested in the incarnation of Jesus Christ, who has made salvation possible by mediating God and humanity. The scandalous love of Christ Jesus on the cross is the culmination of God's promise for reconciliation.

On October 1, Saturday, Wilmore Community will host a community picnic and has invited our church members to be part of it. Two years ago, a few our members began to attend the Wilmore Community's quarterly meetings and provided refreshments with them. We also hosted December dinners for Wilmore Community last two years. Our intentional efforts to build relationship with the surrounding local community will continue. This time Wilmore Community offered an invitation for us to be their guests at the community picnic.

The way toward reconciliation takes a long time, and it requires our intentional, patient, and repetitive encounters with the community people. I extend the invitation from Wilmore Community to you. Please come and join in the community picnic on Oct. $\mathbf{1}^{\text{st}}$ and meet the local residents. Through our continuous relationship building, we may move toward God's reconciliation among diverse people. As your pastor, I am grateful for your willingness to engage with others beyond the church boundary.

PASTOR JAE'S SEPTEMBER SCHEDULE




