What a cultural shock I have experienced in South Korea! I recently attended the 4th Annual Christian Forum for Reconciliation in Northeastern Asia in Jeju Island, South Korea. There were 78 participants from Japan, South Korea, China Mainland, Hong Kong, Taiwan, and the US, including the program staff.

At the Forum, I was introduced as a participant from the US and treated as a foreigner by the Koreans. At the same time, I still felt foreign among the US participants. Living as a stranger – a US citizen from the Koreans' viewpoint and a Korean immigrant to Americans – is not easy. However, it has brought me some thoughts on Christian identity and lifestyle.

First, we are a resident alien on earth. While we live in the US, our ultimate citizenship is in God's kingdom. We belong to God. In other words, we are the people of God and citizens of God's kingdom! Our living on earth as a resident alien is temporary compared to the eternal living in God's kingdom.

Second, we need to embrace strangers and those who look different and live in different ways. As resident aliens, we are called to embrace foreigners and strangers and welcome them into our church as our brothers and sisters.

During a dinner fellowship, I heard various languages and dialects at the opening banquet. While different people were mix-mingled and shared their stories, I suddenly sensed God's presence in our diversity.

All of us may live as strangers to each other due to our different family tradition or lifestyle. When we open our hearts, minds, and doors toward God and others, we may become a mature and loving church where all are welcomed and embraced!
