BEING SMALL AND HUMBLE

The worldly culture teaches us that big and great is better than small and that more is better than less. While they seemingly make sense to us, Jesus' teaching is radically different. From the parable of a mustard seed in Matthew 13:31-32, Jesus reveals the kingdom of God.

Jesus introduces that a mustard seed is the smallest one and grows and becomes the greatest of shrubs. The change from the smallest to greatest of shrubs is a surprising secret of the kingdom of God. "Being small" implies its potential for a surprising growth. In fact, smallness is not a demerit or failure. Rather, being small has its own beauty as it is. In particular, I discover strengths of a small church which is like an extended family. By being small, people may know each other and keep deeper relationships together. Most of all, in a small church each person has a significant meaning as a constituent part of one body. I plan to develop small groups at Calvary because people can truly listen to each other and share their lives in a small group.

I also learn "being humble" in the parable of a mustard seed. While it grows and becomes the greatest of shrubs, the mustard tree is not a gigantic oak tree. It is still a shrub. In other words, God's kingdom does not require us to be great or perfect. It recognizes our weakness, vulnerability, and limitedness. The beauty of being humble is to do God's missions while we have our own weakness, vulnerability, and limitedness. A small church can provide hospitality and caring support for others as a mustard tree provides nests for the birds.

We are called to be a church in which we must have a foretaste of the kingdom of God. As a church of loving people, Calvary is blessed with its being small and humble. Let's discover God's working hands among us even in our smallness.
