What Does a Disciple Look Like?

By contrast, the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. There is no law against such things. (Galatians 5:22-23)


Mary Kearns was a shaker and mover at Bethlehem United Methodist Church back in the day when I was her pastor. A retired middle school science teacher, Mary was the orchestrator of ministries of fellowship and caring. She was a cooker of chickens for our annual Brunswick Stew Sale. She was the organizer of trips for senior adults and the planner of craft projects for our Basket Cases. If she complained about the "frog in her throat," then it must have come from the "crick in her neck." She approached life lightly, with a sense of humor, and a spirit of charity toward all. And she was only one of a host of Christians I've encountered in my life who help me define what a disciple of Jesus looks like.

I've been asking myself lately how to recognize a disciple. If the mission of the church is to "make disciples for the transformation of the world," then we ought to have an image of what the goal is. If we have an idea of what a disciple of Jesus looks like, then maybe we can talk more seriously about how to form such a person.

Paul's letter to the Galatians gives us such an image as he describes the fruit of the Spirit. I can identify several of those fruit, or attributes, in Mary Kearns. Another image that has been helpful to me of late comes from our United Methodist Discipleship Ministries. Using the traditional Jerusalem cross as an anchor image, they provide a graphic representation of characteristics of a fully formed disciple of Jesus Christ:

As you can see from this image, a disciple is one who is spiritually formed in both private and public domains, in both inner devotion and outward action.

As churches, a good question for us to ask ourselves is whether we are spiritually forming disciples who look like the above image? And if we are not, how might we change our disciple-making strategy in order to make disciples who are conformed to the image of Jesus? We might even ask if we actually have a disciple-making strategy? If making disciples is the mission of the United Methodist Church, do we have a system or a process in place aimed at creating fully formed disciples of Jesus?

I issue this as a challenge to each congregation in the Metro District that we ask ourselves these questions. In a world that is increasingly divided there is great need for disciples of Jesus Christ who are working to transform the world. May our churches be places and people where disciples are being made.
