PROJECT AGAPE REPORT

The Outreach Team would like to thank everyone for the donations to Project Agape. Twenty-two boxes were packed consisting of clothing, school supplies, and 67 pair of children's shoes. We especially appreciate your monetary donations to buy so many pair of shoes for the children.

HURRICANE FLORENCE RESPONSE

We have all watched on TV the devastation left behind from Hurricane Florence and felt the grief of those families who are grieving the loss of family members.

Bishop Hope Ward, the North Carolina Conference Bishop, visited areas around Fayetteville to see firsthand the damage caused by flooding and high winds. She said the recovery in the eastern part of our state would take a long time.

UMCOR has already responded with a \$10,000 emergency grant for Hurricane Florence, and the North Carolina Conference expects to receive additional funding after the damage has been accessed. Already 1,000 health kits have been distributed to the local shelters, and 1,000 cleaning buckets have been distributed to some of the counties where it was safe to travel.

In the past UMCOR assigned advance numbers to disasters such as this, but now they only have two advance numbers—Disaster Response United States and International Disaster Response.

The Outreach Team decided to forward the donations received directly to the North Carolina Conference because 100% of our donations will be used to help the people in the eastern part of our state affected by this hurricane.
