#### LIVING ON THE MARGIN

Now those who were scattered because of the persecution that took place over Stephen traveled as far as Phoenicia, Cyprus, and Antioch, and they spoke the word to no one except Jews. But among them were some men of Cyprus and Cyrene who, on coming to Antioch, spoke to the Hellenists also, proclaiming the Lord Jesus. The hand of the Lord was with them, and a great number became believers and turned to the Lord. (Acts 11:19-21)

In the Book of Acts, we observe how God changes challenges and crises into opportunities. The early followers of Jesus were scattered, escaping from the brutal persecution in Jerusalem. Through this trial, paradoxically, the words of God and the salvific works of Jesus Christ were spread out beyond Jerusaelm and Judea. More Gentiles have heard the good news of Jesus Christ and become believers and turned to Christ Jesus. The Early Church was built on the margin!

Today we live in the post-Christendom era. This means that the church and Christian believers are not on the center anymore. In fact, many churches are declining and closing in the U.S. Once American communities put the church on the center: All commercial stores were closed on Sundays, and most residents worshipped God as extended families.

However, today's Sundays are different from those of the Christendom era: All business stores are open and busy; children and adults have their sports and arts performances; and there are great choices of entertainments on Sundays.

How do we live on the margin? Are we supposed to be invisible or silent in front of the gigantic mammon power today?

Surprisingly, it can be an opportunity for us to witness how God works from the margin. Living on the margin may lead us to go back to the basic, to the early Christian example, and to total dependence on God's grace. How's your living on the margin?
